Dogs communicate with us through body language, facial expressions, bark, sobbing and grunting. These signals can be difficult to interpret accurately. These tips will show you how to prevent dog bites and other antisocial behaviors that you know and greet strange dogs in a non-threatening way. When you meet a strange dog, be sure to obtain the owner's permission before touching it. Some dogs work like guide dogs, so you have to stay focused on your work. Other dogs should not be petted, because they are sick, injured, shy, protective, or afraid of children. If the owner has permission, slowly and quietly approach the dog, curling its fingers slightly and providing the back of the hand for the dog to sniff. Ask the owner of the dog where the dog will be loved, where it will be gently loved. Don't get close to stray dogs. Walk slowly – don't run. When the dog approaches you, stand still with your arms aside until the dog leaves. Do not yell, shake your hand or look directly into the dog's eyes. The American Kennel Club, in its publication The Complete Dog Book for Children (Hungry Minds, 1996), offers this advice on how to greet a dog: Approach the dog from the front or side. Hold your hands low and speak softly. If you surprise the dog from behind, push it into a corner, shake his hands or scream, he can excite him and jump into fear and play. Respect the body of the dog. Do not pull her tail, legs, fur, or ears, do not touch her eyes. Learn to gently pet your dog in her favorite place, such as under the chin or on the chest. Pay attention to the body language of the dog. Dogs try to let us know that they feel threatened by their posture and sound. Don't stand up to dogs barking, growling or showing their teeth. Hard feet, back of ears, raised tails, hair standing on the edges are all signs that the dog is feeling defensive. If you do not show attention to the dog's warning and you keep approaching, the dog is very likely to bite. Do not try to take food, bones and toys from the dog's mouth. If the toy is a child's and the dog is willing or does not abandon it in command, the child should call an adult for help. Discourages pulling and rough housing games. Of all the excitement, it's easy for the dog to miss the toy and latch on to you. Give it a tryFrisbee, and hide and seek for some safe fun. Let the dog eat and sleep in peace. Dogs can take eating very seriously and defend very much around their food bowls. Like people, dogs need sleep and can get grumpy when they wake up. Take the face off the dog's face, especially from the unfamiliar dog. If you accidentally hurt or scare the dog, her first instinct will be to snap and the closest part of you to snap will be your face. But how do you manage all her gear and vacation with baby and towing? First, I was too busy getting my new life in shape and worried about how to adapt to travel as a family. But now, both you and your baby are probably possible and you are more than willing to escape! But with the baby and all the gear in tow, it seems mind-good to travel easily before. To minimize the hassle, follow these tips: Create a list and start packing at least a week in. Pack two diaper bags, one for storing in the car or for getting on the plane. Each bag should be filled with: a sealed plastic bag liquid baby soap (also used for shampoo) wipes (also used for shampoos) talc-free powder and diaper rash ointment Two or three burp cloths are gentleSoap disposable diapers change pad two baby blankets (1 light weight, 1 warm) infant decing and two changes in clothing emergency kit including acetaminophen, thermometer, baby bandage, ipecac, gauze, nail cutting, antibacterial Keep your favorite toy finger food itinerary loose, packed into cream, a copy of a prescription for the medication your baby needs, and sunscreen with a pacifier on your pediatrician's phone number, rattles, a few bottle bibs of juice or water baby food formula. Set a moderate pace and include a rest area to allow time to take care of your baby. Don't expect to do as much as you could before she comes. Make sure you safely check your bedroom away from home. Make sure the crib slats are no more than 2 3/8 inches (or bring a portable crib), the outlet is capped and electrical cords, draped ties and open windows are not accessible to the baby. If you are flying, bring a child carrier or backpack, so you have your hands free to juggle luggage. Book an aisle seat or arrive at the airport early to get a bulkhead seat, comfortable with the most leg room for you and your baby. Don't forget your car seat. Most safety experts recommend buying your baby a plane ticket and using your car safety seat to buckle him safely. Still, there are additional costs. Some airlines allow you to use empty seats on less crowded flights, but if you're traveling during peak hours, you should carefully consider your options and your baby's safety. In any case, when you arrive at your destination, you will surely need a safety seat to transport your baby in the car. Make sure the car seat you bring is approved for air travel (width can't exceed 16 inches). Of course, if you're travelling by plane, try changing your baby's diaper just before boarding, as it can be difficult to change on board and disturb other passengers. Take regular breaks. Discomfort may be unavoidable when traveling long distances by car. Try to plan your road trip around your child's sleep schedule. When your baby is waking up, take her out of her car seat every two hours for some hugs, movement, and a little fresh air. Remember that she is in a very active phase and car seats are likely to cramp her style somewhat. Also, the adult needs to take turns sitting in the back seat with her so that she doesn't get bored and lonely while you cover the miles. Km.
